




Social Work Opportunities



Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council Usma Family and Child Services is creating an eligibility list of qualified Social Workers for assignment to a number of Social Work vacancies within the Usma program over the coming weeks. Assignments can be in either rural or urban settings. Our Usma program specializes in providing professional, ethical, culturally sensitive, and responsible social work services to Nuu-chah-nulth families and children.

Responsibilities involve:

- ◆ Carrying a case load pertaining to the protection of children, guardianship of children-in-care, approval of resources and the provision of family support services;
- ◆ Consult with Bands around community development with a focus on prevention of child abuse and neglect;
- ◆ Responsibilities may include court requirements.

Our Social Workers receive a competitive salary, benefit package, subsidized travel, and self-directed professional development plus regular in-service.

Preferred Qualifications:

To be considered for a position, you must have a BSW or degree in a related field and possess C-6 (preferred) or C-4 Delegation; plus, having worked in delegated services to First Nation children and families within the last year, and provides acceptable references and criminal record check.
